

This talk will contextualise the argument that Sutan Puasa was the founding father, prime mover, builder and benefactor of Malaysia's capital city. Yet today, not even a street is named after him. Sutan Puasa is deserving of public memorialisation and the case is hereby presented.

Endgame: The Battle of Kuala Lumpur

A young Mandailing named Abu Bakar witnessed assymetrical warfare between two forces, one ensconced in Bukit Nanas and the other in Bukit Resam (Bukit Makhamah). In 1873, this decisive battle of the long-drawn-out Klang War turned Kuala Lumpur into a bloody battleground.

Swettenham played a crucial role in the layout and planning for modern Kuala Lumpur in the 1880s. But there was scandal as well.

Whose Kuala Lumpur? Social History and the Polyglot City How do we approach Kuala Lumpur's foundational history? In recent times much debate has settled on the protagonists of Kuala Lumpur's founding history. This intervention seeks to explore Kuala Lumpur within a broader perspective, examining the evolution of a city through its social interactions. As emphasised by the late National Historian, Khoo Kay Kim, much of Malaysia's history is best gleaned from its social history, eschewing the "contributions" approach to examining one of historical 'roles.'

Eddin Khoo is a poet, writer, translator, and journalist. He is Senior Fellow at Institute of Strategic & International Studies (ISIS Malaysia). He is also Founder of PUSAKA, one of the region's leading cultural centres.
